



Port Authority Police Arrest Teen in Connection with Armed Robbery

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE - (June 6, 2025) - A 15-year-old boy from the city's Greenfield neighborhood has been arrested in connection with an armed robbery that occurred on a Pittsburgh Regional Transit bus in the South Side last week.

Police say the teen was one of four suspects who attempted to rob a woman on the bus shortly after 9 p.m. on Thursday, May 29, near Sarah and South 26th streets. The woman's husband intervened, leading to a physical altercation in which one of the suspects pulled a handgun. The husband wrestled the weapon away and handed it to his wife, who exited the bus with the firearm.

The gun was later recovered by police and found to have been reported stolen from the Keystone Shooting Center in Butler County.

Investigators reviewed surveillance footage and issued a BOLO (Be On the Lookout) to local agencies. On June 3, Pittsburgh Public Schools Police Chief Mike Boback contacted authorities after recognizing one of the suspects as a former student. The teen was arrested without incident this morning.

He is charged as an adult with two counts of robbery, and one count each of conspiracy, receiving stolen property, carrying a firearm without a license, terroristic threats, and possession of a firearm by a minor. He also faces three counts of reckless endangerment.

The investigation into the other suspects is ongoing.

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
