



## ***Seasonal Service Adjustments Update***

**FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE** (October 16, 2025) – Several of the proposed seasonal service adjustments Pittsburgh Regional Transit had expected to begin on Sunday, October 19 will be delayed or not implemented.

### **The Waterfront**

Buses will continue to serve the bus stops in front of Giant Eagle and Target at The Waterfront in Homestead following significant support to keep those stops.

Longer term, PRT is working with The Waterfront to create a new bus stop between Giant Eagle and Target. PRT will provide an update once those plans are confirmed.

### **Herron Avenue Bridge**

The 54-North Side-Oakland-South Side will continue to use the Herron Avenue Bridge following repairs completed by the City of Pittsburgh.

### **Pittsburgh International Airport**

The 28X-Airport Flyer will serve the new airport terminal as soon as it opens.

The frequency of the 28X to the new terminal will decrease to accommodate travel time to and from a new layover location. On weekdays, buses will operate every 32 minutes until 10 p.m. and then every 44 minutes from 10 p.m. until the end of service; every 33 minutes on Saturdays; and every 36 minutes on Sundays.

### **Mt. Washington Transit Tunnel**

Buses will continue to be detoured via the Wabash Tunnel and light-rail cars via Allentown until the Mt. Washington Transit Tunnel reopens.

Rail cars will continue to serve the stop at Allen Street, and the free rail shuttle will continue to serve Station Square until the tunnel reopens. The Silver Line will resume service between Library to Allegheny stations.

All detoured bus and light rail routes will return to regular routing through the transit tunnel once it reopens.
