#### 1. **Approval of Minutes**

The minutes of the April 20, 2023, Planning & Stakeholder Relations Committee were approved.

#### 2. **June 2023 Service Changes (Director of Transit Scheduling Phillip St. Pierre)**

These changes include:

- Running Time Adjustments
- Frequency Changes
- Routing Changes
- Trip Adjustments

Daily running time adjustments will be made to routes: 20, 22, 24, 52L, 60, 64, 67, 71A, 71B, 71C, 71D, 81, 83, and P68. Weekday running time adjustments will be made to routes: 28X, 53L, 71, P7, P12, P67, and P71. And weekend running time adjustments will be made to routes 4 and 53.

Due to running time adjustments on some trips, frequency changes will be made for the following routes:

- 20 - Daily - From 60 minutes to 55 minutes frequency all day
- 22 - Sundays - From 70 minutes to 65 minutes frequency all day
- 24- Sundays - From 45 minutes to 55 minutes frequency all day

The following routes will have modifications to the routing:

- 24 - Discontinue Pitchfork Lane deviation in AM/PM peaks
- 41 - Route extended to Penn Station for operator relief
- 54 - Route extended to Allegheny Station for operator relief
- 60 - Route designed into a loop routing
- 67 - Route modified to begin service at Monroeville VA Clinic

- P68 -Route modified to begin service at Monroeville VA Clinic

The following routes will have modifications to the times of trips:

- 57 - Daily- Some trip times shifted
- 69 - Daily - Some trip times shifted
- 77 - Weekdays - Additional late evening trips
- 52L - Weekdays - Some trip times shifted
- 53L - Weekdays - Some trip times shifted
- P76 - Weekdays - Some trip times shifted
- 61D - Saturdays - Some trip times shifted
- 86 - Weekends - Some trip times shifted
- 87 - Weekends - Some trip times shifted
- 88 - Weekends - Some trip times shifted

### **3. Overview of ACCESS Transportation Systems (Paratransit) (Karen Hoesch)**

Sponsored by PRT and working with other community partners, ACCESS helps connect eligible individuals to trips to events, shopping medical services and more. ACCESS also helps reduce the cost of fares on PRT service, linking individuals to PRT service with rides to nearby stops, and other amenities.

This partnership allows fixed route PRT service and paratransit to work together to provide the best experience for those individuals.
